



Scoil Chois Claí is a three-day political festival structured around workshops, lectures and debates, in English and Irish, with the added ceol traidisiúnta. craic and (for those who indulge) creamy pints of stout. The main focus of the festival is climate breakdown, alternatives to capitalism, imperialism and the rise of the far right. Speakers include trade union and community activists, researchers, academics and veterans of the left from Ireland and further afield.

Scoil Chois Claí 2023 is the second school organised by LeftBloc, a collaborative political education project that brings together ecosocialist activists from political parties, social movements, community campaigns and trade unions to encourage new efforts in working-class self-education. It is organised with the comradely support of the Rosa Luxemburg Stiftung, Trademark Belfast and a number of other trade unions and progressive institutions.

'Scoileanna chois claí' or 'hedge schools' were a network of informal. roadside schools that emerged, out of sight of Crown authorities beneath the sunny side of a hedge following the collapse of the Gaelic world during the colonial period and ensuing Penal Laws. With communities taking education into their own hands, these hedge schools offered instruction through Irish in subjects such as Maths, Philosophy, Latin and Greek. Robert Peel, the British Prime Minister, famously said of the schools' impact:

"I do not wish to see children in Ireland educated like ... the young peasants of Kerry who run about in rags with a Cicero or Virgil under their arms."

Travel

We recommend that participants travel to the island of Inis Óírr (Inisheer) via Doolin, County Clare.

Route 1 : Dublin - Doolin – Inis Óírr (Recommended)

Buses and trains from central Dublin take you to Galway. From there, take the 350 Bus Éireann to Doolin. Buses run five times a day between Galway and Doolin. All services run direct with no transfers required, and take on average 1h 55m. The schedules can be found here. **Bus - https://buseireann.ie/ Rail - https://www.irishrail.ie/**

If you are driving, take the M4 out of Dublin, follow signs for Sligo/Westport/Galway/N5/N6. Keep left at the fork to continue on M6, following signs for Galway/Athlone. At junction 18, exit onto M18 towards Limerick. At junction 16, exit toward R458/ Loughrea/Gort and follow signs for Doolin.

Ferries leave from Doolin, County Clare to Inis Oírr. The journey takes 15 minutes and you can purchase tickets online **www.doolinferries.com** or at the ferry terminal. Phone: **+353 65 7074 455**. Route 2 : Dublin - Ros a Mhíl (Rossaveal) – Inis Óírr

If you decide to take the ferry from Ros a Mhíl (Rossaveal) County Galway, you can buy tickets online

This ferry only has two sailings a day, **10:30am** or **13:00pm** on Fridays. We recommend the early ferry on the Friday as the late ferry will mean you miss the opening session with Clare Daly. Return times for the Sunday are **8:45am, 11:30am and 16:30pm.**



Arrival

Scoil Chois Clái kicks off at 6:00pm on 8 September at **Coláiste Ghobnait.** As detailed in the programme, the weekend's sessions will move between **the Coláiste** and **Áras Éanna**. It's a ten-minute dander between venues and local transport on the 'Wanderly Wagon' is available for those who require it.

You are expected to be on the island before the festival

begins. When you arrive on the island, go straight to the registration desk at Coláiste Chobnait main hall (signposted), where you will be welcomed by some very nice people, receive your welcome pack and directions to your accommodation. Your ID will have a group number which indicates where to need to be during each session. The venue is too small for a free-for-all so please stick to

your assigned group and make sure that you attend all sessions. All sessions will be recorded and available online after the festival. There should be no one wandering around the island when sessions are taking place.

Food

Breakfast:

Accommodation in the hotels and the various B & Bs provide breakfast both mornings. Those who are camping should bring some breakfast snacks or go to one of the nearby seasonal cafés (you could try fishing and/or foraging if that's your thing).

Lunch:

Tea, coffee, biccies and lunch on the Saturday will be provided free of charge at Áras Éanna.

Dinner:

There are two hotels on the island (Óstan Inis Oírr and Tigh Ruairí) that serve reasonably priced food from a limited menu (vegetarian and vegan options available), where you will be able to get Friday and Saturday night dinner at your own expense.

Chip Van:

In respect of traditional workingclass cuisine, there will be also be a chipper.

Teach Tábhairne / Pub

In addition to the two hotel bars there is the famous Tigh Ned Seafood Pub.
